

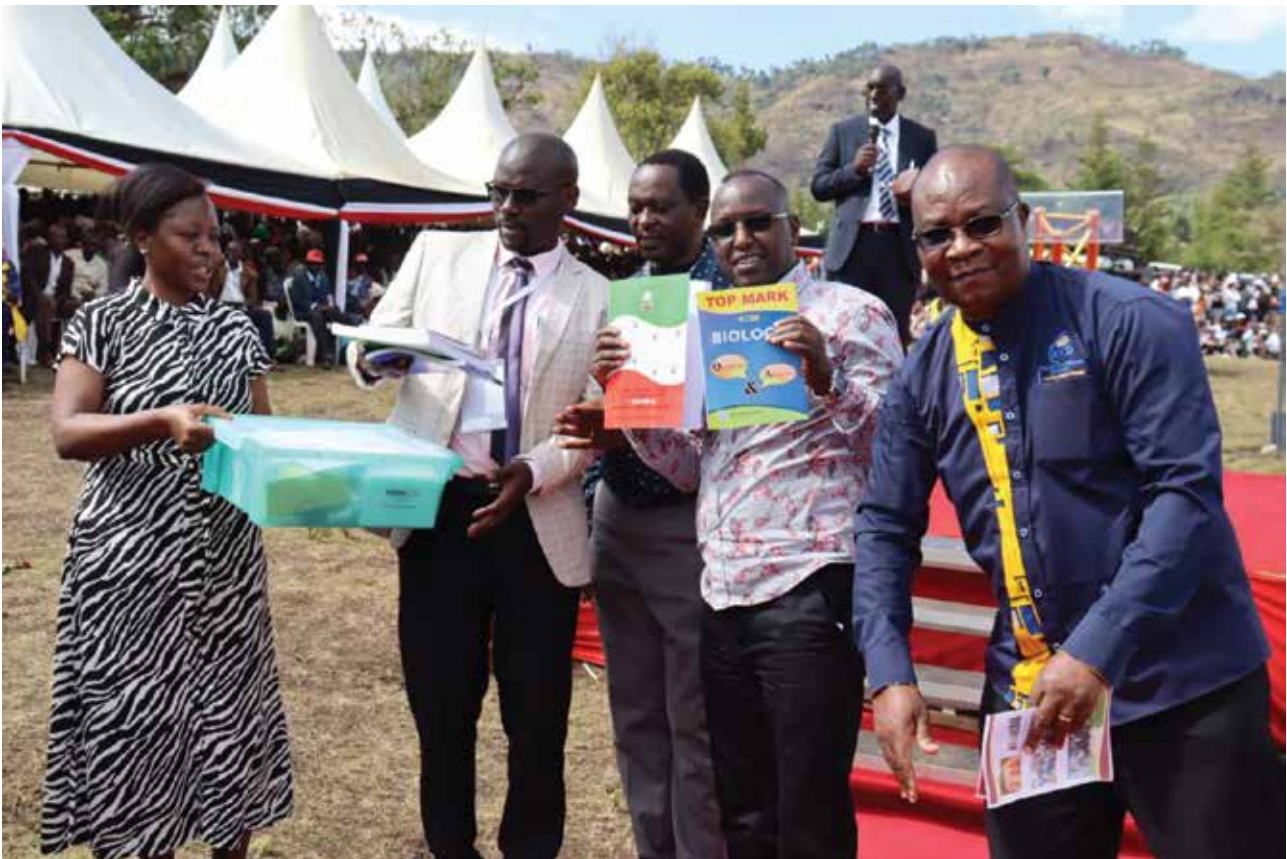
BUREAU's COMMUNITY OUTREACH ACROSS THE COUNTRY

Kenya Literature Bureau is actively engaged in promoting its products and services to educators in the region, while positioning itself as a leader in provision of quality, affordable learning and teaching materials.

Recently, the Bureau's Managing Director, Mr Victor Lomaria, led other publishers in donating books to schools in Uasin Gishu and Nandi Counties. This was part of the Bureau's Corporate Social Value program **Twachapisha Mwasoma**.

The books were donated at different functions led by the Ministry of Education's Principal Secretary for Early Learning and Basic Education, Dr Belio Kipsang and Cabinet Secretary, Hon. Ezekiel Machogu respectively.

Various publishers, among them Jomo Kenyatta Foundation, Longhorn Publishers, East African Educational Publishers, Moran Publishers and Hillman Publishers donated various course, library, reference and reading materials valued to a tune of Kshs 1 million.

Our products and services were also exhibited during the 11th Lake Region Economic Block (LREB) Conference held in Migori County under the theme "Partnerships for Sustainable Development: County Responses to Blue Economy and Climate Change Adaptation in the Lake Region." The convention hosted a number of exhibitors from different industries who play a role in promoting growth in various sectors in the region. General Manager-Commercial Services Division, Mr Evans Nyachieng'a led the KLB team in creating new avenues to further existing partnerships the Bureau has with different Counties in the LREB.

So far, KLB has managed to rope in 11 of the 14 Counties that constitute the bloc.
